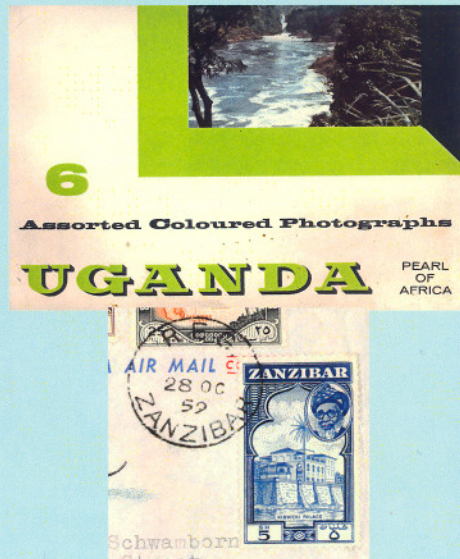

K S WELCOMES THE WALLY BYAM CARAVAN

ASMARA, ERITREA...Yesterday afternoon around 3:00 PM, The Wally Byam Caravan Club rolled into Asmara and was greeted by Capt. Cornetaky, Post Provost Marshal upon their arrival. Shortly afterward, Lt. Col Robert G. Harris, Post Commander greeted Wally and his group along with the members of the U. S. Consulate and the WBI. Wally expressed his feelings that he was greatly thankful for what the U. S. Army had done for their stay here in Asmara. The Wally Byam Caravan is a group of ordinary American tourists traveling together with their families. These people are from all over the United States, led by Mr. Wally Byam, and referred to as the Wally Byam Caravanners and the Wally Byam Caravan Club. They are a group of congenial, happy people, traveling along together and operating as a mobile democracy. On this particular trip, it is Wally's 27th caravan since he started caravanning in 1932. The Caravan started in Ogden and started northward through the Union of South Africa, Rhodesia and Nyasaland, Belgian Congo, Uganda and Kenya and Ethiopia and Eritrea. From here, they will head for Harar and the Bilo Valley. They will be staying here in Asmara for about four days and then heading for Harar, hoping to reach there before Christmas. For those interested in seeing the group, their camp is located at the end of Avenue Haile Selassie, opposite the White Apartments. The group will welcome anyone who would like to see their trailers and talk to anyone about their trip. One thing they said was they were sure glad to see some Americans for a change.

RECEIVED MARSHAL WELCOME IN ETHIOPIA. Wally Byam stated that he and his group had received their warmest welcome and hospitality in Ethiopia then on any of his other 27 caravans all over the world. The caravanners have been to such places as South America, Central America, Canada, New Scotland, Newfoundland, all over the United States, up the Alaska Highway to Alaska, all over Europe and now Africa. Wally Byam stated that he and his group were very glad to have been given an audience with HIM Haile Selassie in his Throne Room.
