Tip of the Month - Cool Weather Camping

Cool weather camping means being prepared and taking a few precautions. Cooler weather usually means more hours of darkness which means more lights. It also means the furnace will be run and that can be a significant battery drain. If the battery compartment is at outside temperatures, it will also lose capacity at lower temperatures. A shortage of battery energy is likely to be one of the first things you notice about the impact of cooler weather on your camping experience.


You need to make sure to top off the propane tanks before you head out for a weekend in cooler weather. Propane is used to keep you and your stuff warm and comfortable and the colder it gets the faster you will use it. A furnace keeping the inside of your RV above freezing will also likely keep most of the plumbing systems from freezing. Hookup lines and tanks exposed to the outside air will need attention when outside temperatures get well below freezing.

What to do

- 1. Prepare for extra battery use by taking along spares, providing a means to keep your battery charged, or doing other things to reduce the risk of running out of battery energy.
- 2. Make sure your propane tanks don't run dry on you, and protect the propane regulator from the elements so it doesn't get plugged or blocked. Make sure your furnace is functioning properly, and keep the thermostat as low as possible.
- 3. Take plenty of clothing and bedding so you can implement a good layers of warmth policy to maintain comfort.
- 4. Don't use anything for heating your RV that is not designed for space heating purposes in an RV. Do not use the stovetop burners or oven to heat your RV.
- 5. Any combustion based heating, such as catalytic heaters, must only be used when you make sure that there is proper ventilation and the device is not left unattended.
- 6. Whenever you cook condensation can be a problem so make sure there is proper ventilation.
- 7. Prepare yourself and your rig so you know what to expect and what to do to be comfortable and safe. Enjoy your winter camping experience. (Article condensed from the SNU website Owner's Manual. For more information go to the website at www.sierranevadaairstreams.org/)
