The Jackson Center Factory

I was fortunate enough to be chosen to attend a training session at the Airstream factory in Jackson Center Ohio last December. Ever since I started working here at Mountain Family RV I have developed a love for the Airstreams. Visiting the factory was a great experience, it gave me the opportunity to see the Airstreams being built as opposed to just having someone tell me about them.

One of the amazing things about building an Airstream is the amount of man hours that goes into the construction of each unit. Everything from the way they assemble the rubber torsion bar axel, stretch and form each aluminum panel on the ends, to the two people who rivet the skin together. The only thing that is done by computer are the cabinets, even most of the cushions are cut out and sewn together by several women.

The work environment is another thing that is different than a lot of factory's I have seen. There are two and even three generations of families working for Airstream. The job is not just an assembly line kind of job; it requires a great deal of Craftsmanship.

All in all it was a day filled with fun, learning, and a new appreciation for Airstreams. I encourage anyone who has a chance to visit the Jackson Center facility to do it. You will not be disappointed.
