#### Cold Weather Hints

Cold weather doesn't have to mean an end to your camping experiences. It does mean you have to plan a little differently and take some extra precautions. Where cooler weather takes its first toll is in the house battery. Next after battery life is propane. As the temperatures get colder, there are other issues that become a concern including plumbing and sanitation. Then of course, you need to be sure to have appropriate clothing and bedding. Here are a few tips for cold weather camping.

## Trailer Camping Practices for Lower Temperatures

- 1. Prepare for extra battery use by taking along spares, providing a means to keep your battery charged, or doing other things to reduce the risk of running out of battery energy.
- 2. Make sure your propane tanks don't run dry on you, top them off prior to leaving.
- 3. Protect the propane regulator from the elements so it doesn't get plugged or blocked.
- 4. Take plenty of clothing and bedding so you can implement a good layers of warmth policy to maintain comfort.
- 5. Make sure your furnace is functioning properly.
- 6. Don't use anything for heating your RV that is not designed for space heating purposes in an RV.
- 7. Only use the furnace overnight but do keep the thermostat as low as possible.
- 8. Any combustion based heating, such as catalytic heaters, must only be used when you make sure that there is proper ventilation and the device is not left unattended.
- 9. Whenever you cook or clean condensation can be a problem (see article) so make sure there is proper ventilation.
- 10. Prepare your rig for the temperatures you plan to experience. See John Sankey's **advice** for when you are going to be out in very cold weather for some ideas.
- 11. Prepare yourself so you know what to expect and what to do to be comfortable and safe.
- 12. Take the equipment and supplies you need to enjoy your winter camping experience.



#### **Obituaries**

Wade Thompson died of cancer on November 12th at age 69. Mr. Thompson purchased an iconic but failing brand, Airstream in the midst of a business downturn for recreational vehicles in 1980. He turned Thor Industries around by adding many other RV manufactures to its quiver, increasing their RV sales to lead the nation.

In 2007, when oil prices rose and a recession followed, he closed factories and cut jobs keeping Thor Industries alive while others in the industry filed for bankruptcy. The fate of Thor Industries and the Airstream brand will be in the hands of the CEO that fills in behind Mr. Thompson.

# Restoration Story by Rick LaBorde

Is your vintage airstream in need of a good lift? Many older trailers with torsion axles tend to sag a bit from many years of heavy weight resting on their axles. My '64 Safari was no exception to this problem. After 5 or so years of watching interior rivets pop out from harsh road stress, I decided a few years back that I had better try to tackle this particular job before I started seeing permanent damage.

Doing some online research I found that a close nephew to my old axle could be purchased at Inland RV, so I headed down to Covina to pick it up in my Honda Odyssey. It barely fit stretching from between the bucket seats in the front to the rear hatch. I jacked the trailer up supporting the frame with numerous large rounds from a tree and proceeded to take out my tired old axle. Of course when I went to dry fit the new axle I found that not only did the new axle not match the old bolt pattern but it was going to raise the trailer about an inch. I decided this was a good thing so I cut off the brackets for the shocks (which were in the wrong location for my application) and bolted it up. After welding the shock brackets in the correct location and wiring up the brakes, the job was done. I set the ole Safari back on her feet only to find that I had actually raised it some two inches higher since the new axle was tight and not worn out like my old one. This has worked out very well for it's ground clearance and for me as changing out tires is now much easier. So if your not quite retired Airstream is not showing much of the top of your tires you to may want to check into getting a new axle or two depending on your trailer. It will ride much better and will keep it from shaking apart on rough roads. Who know your dishes may even stay in the cabinets. If you do decide to take on a restoration project, don't hesitate to ask some of the other members for some tips as most have had some kind of experience that may just save you some time.
