### Strawberry Music Festival

#### From our Obsidian Dome Host - Rick LaBorde

If you think the SNU wrote the book on random camping then head out next year to the <u>Strawberry Music</u> <u>Festival</u>. It is held twice each year on Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends. Over 7000 folks camping in a primitive meadow and forest at Camp Mather near Hetch Hetchy Dam in California. We pack up the airstream each year in the fall and join in on the folk music and events. This year we were joined by two other families from Mono Lake. A great time for kids of all ages. Guy brought along a friend and the two of them road their bikes all over the place. Lots of wonderful folk music all weekend and people packed randomly into every open space. This year there were about 8 other airstreams at the event. Due to the fire in Yosemite N.P., I had to drive over via Sonora Pass to get to the event. It was the most wonderful pull I have ever done with the Airstream. I left late at night to avoid traffic and the full moon illuminated my travel over the pass, which brought back many memories of taking motorcycle rides over Sonora over 25 years ago. This pass is not to be taken lightly and I would not recommend hauling anything over 22 feet on this road. There are many hair pin steep turns that require taking up all of your lane and then some. I had the whole road to myself that night and appreciated the extra bit of road when I needed it. We were all very happy with the decision to upgrade our tow vehicle last fall as I don't think our Pathfinder would have liked this route much. Thanks to the efforts of many firefighters, Tioga Road opened on Monday and we were able to return home via Hwy. 120, which saved us many hours.

Don't forget to do your winterizing, freezing weather is just around the corner and fixing broken water lines is much harder than preparing your rig for the winter. It also helps to crawl under the trailer and look for any new access points for mice that might have opened up in your travels this past summer. A little aluminum work can seal up almost any hole.
