

Prez Meanderings

The June Rally at a camping area along the Green Creek was my idea. Green Creek is a tributary of the East Walker River and the creek is accessed by Green Creek Road off US 395 about 5 miles south of Bridgeport, California. The camping area I chose was about 6.5 miles south on Green Creek Road from the intersection of US 395. Green Creek Rd is a wide but rough dirt road. The camping area I chose was a popular area with a fairly large open area that could accommodate about 8-10 trailers. When I originally scouted out this area it was earlier in the year and there were only a few bugs but I suspected that the water adjacent to the camping area might mean more bugs. There were indeed more bugs particularly mosquitoes and we brought out all our defensive measures. They were moderately effective.

The Rally was originally scheduled for 20-23 June but I asked for a change so I could attend a rally with the military camping group I belong to. It turned out I had problems at home that I had to attend to when I would have left for the other rally. I could have made the original date. Fire restrictions went into effect on Friday the 28 and we were not allowed a fire on Friday or Saturday.

The abundance of bugs did have one positive effect, it brought out the Tree Swallows. If you look this bird up in your bird book the picture doesn't do them justice. They have iridescent blue-green feathers on their back that make them very attractive. Like most swallows they are spectacular fliers. They particularly liked to hunt bugs in the open area of our campsite. At times there were up to four of them cavorting in and around our campsite to entertain us. Unfortunately they didn't seem to have an impact on the mosquito population.

The gurgling creek running by our campsite added to the pleasant surroundings as did the tall trees and beautiful view up the canyon. There was still a little snow in pockets on the north sides of the peaks.

To sum it up - long rough ride to the campsite, picturesque setting, irritating mosquitoes entertaining Tree Swallows, no camp fire and a comforting babbling stream.

Huron WBCCI Rally

Gail said great trip or was it glad as Hell the traveling is over. We just missed the parkers so will stay here in the Bull Pen until morning. Remember to ask me about the Backcountry Byway we took on Sunday morning. We (I) didn't know that about 40 miles was dirt Forest Service Road. While not required, 10 miles in 4X4 and low range made it easier on the engine and transmission (steep).



Don was the SNU delegate at the International Rally. He'll have a thorough report on the rally for the August newsletter but here is what he said about the key agenda items at the Delegate's meeting.

The slate of officers was elected with a nomination from the floor for the second Nominating Committee member, Ann Worth for NM Unit. The Motorhome Amendment was called for the question immediately so no discussion. It was defeated, 1493 for and 3301 against. No other business.

Flying the Flags

Flag flying has always been a big WBCCI tradition. There is a good part of the WBCCI policy book devoted to properly flying flags. The policies follow international flag etiquette and establish standards for the association identity. The presentation of flags identifies the group and the individual. It shows respect for the nation, the association and the individual represented. One idea that may help to understand flags at WBCCI events is that they are not flown but rather presented. Members have a pole holder mounted to their front jack that provides a mounting point for three or five flag poles. There are very detailed guidelines for the proper way to present flags in a group and which one should go where. When all flags are at about the same height their order of precedence is left to right. If one is presented higher than the others it should be at the center position and fly the US flag. Note that the typical RV flag pole



holder presents the poles like spokes on a wheel so the center one will usually be higher than those on either side. As for flag poles, some people go to the local home improvement store and pick up a broom extension handle to use as a flag pole. Others think about flying flags and figure that higher is better. The fact is that most of the flag poles you can find on the internet or in stores are either too short, as for wall mounting home display, or too long, as for vertical flag flying well above anything in the vicinity. Your flag poles should be flag poles! They should have a proper finial at the top and solid flag attachments that will keep the flag flying properly. Ten to twelve feet has proven a good length for a 3x5 flag presented on the front of an RV. Watch out for segmented poles as they often use twist lock or friction to keep the pole extended and wind vibration may loosen that and collapse your pole. Flag pole stands for RV's can be rather hard to find as every RV and every RV'er seems to need something different That is why most SNU flag pole stands are custom fabricated. Jerry and I ended up with Harbor Freight flag pole kits. These included a base for mounting the poles that make constructing a holder a simple matter of creating something to clamp them to. I just used angle iron for the footer and header and a bunch of clamps. Jerry made a stand that was held in place with a trailer ball for a bases mount.
