The SNU has historically hosted rallies at National Forest, Bureau of Land Management, state and local lands. These lands offer beautiful settings in the deserts, forests and mountains; many are in campgrounds but some are considered dispersed area where camping is allowed anywhere. Some rally sites lack local amenities; some lack hookups at the sites or even in the campground.

The SNU decided to add rallies with more amenities to increase member participation; our initial efforts in 2009 added Weed Heights RV Park with full hookups and WiFi that allowed members to run furnaces to keep out the March chill. Later rallies at Weeds meant SNU members could run air conditioners to keep out the summer heat. The SNU's 35th anniversary rally at Campground by the Lake in South Lake Tahoe, CA offered electric at each site and touristy venues in the area. Our most recent rally having hookups that we can remember was last May at Lassen RV Resort near McArthur, CA. Local shops, museums and a swap meet were available within 30 minutes of the RV resort. SNU will visit Lassen RV Resort again in 2016 for our September anniversary rally. With the exception of our rally at Campground by the Lake, rural locations often draw the biggest turnout in SNU members. The Board struggles every year to develop a calendar that includes rally venues that members would enjoy and will help host individual rallies.

One might say we get what ask for when we become the rally hosts. Gail and I get what we ask for when we host the annual SNU rally in Death Valley in the late Fall. We pick the campgrounds, the activities, the meal plans, and the schedule. This year was an exception though. We had to cancel the rally because October storms had damaged roads and closed some of the National Park. Again, as rally hosts, that was our decision supported by the SNU board.



In keeping with its roots, the SNU will always include rallies in scenic out of the way places but we definitely want members participation and help in finding new rally sites and venues. Come out to our winter luncheons and one or more of our 2016 rallies and voice your opinion; maybe become a rally host for your favorite location. You might even want to write an article for the newsletter show-

casing one of your favorite local campgrounds or RV parks. I know editor Rick LaBorde would love some member articles.

Perhaps one of the more obnoxious 'must do' items for the club is finances. The IRS needs an annual report because we have tax exempt status via WBCCI. There is a bank account - 2 really because PayPal and Wells Fargo both qualify - that need to be monitored and managed. Although WBCCI headquarters is picking up more of the dues processing burden, the SNU still needs to be able to handle renewal payments from members., forward the WBCCI portion to headquarters, and deposit the local portion. So how do we keep these obnoxious duties and obligations to a minimum? We do that by keeping the amounts, balances, and number of transactions that need financial controls and bookkeeping to a minimum.

The first part of this is limiting the finances and budgeting concerns to dues. With about 30 members at \$10 each, that's a \$300 on the annual budget income side. We don't prepare a budget expense plan as history shows us that we can use the dues income to handle operating needs as they arise. Of course, a big part of this is planning what the SNU does so that any expected expense is well covered by income.

A second part of reducing the financial management burden is to use the Kitty or 'pass the hat' methods. This means segregating expenses between those things that are known and club specific, those things that are known and member participation specific, those things that are related to participation but best handled as one expense, and anything that doesn't fit in one of these categories.

Your dues take care of the first and the last of these categories. Examples of these expenses include communications and correspondence expenses and special club event or activity costs not handled by in-kind or anonymous donation.

Individual members are expected to handle known specific participation expenses such as park or camping fees. These are expenses they can arrange on their own. Often, members may be able to use an annual State Park permit or Federal senior discount for these expenses.

The participation related but best as a single expense category includes lunches and support for coffee and condiments or special rally related expenses. To cover these expenses, the Kitty is passed around at events so participants can contribute what they see as reasonable. We suggest \$15 per person for lunches and \$5 per rig per night at rallies as this has been shown to yield sufficient contributions to cover expenses. Note that not all contributions are cash. Volunteers sometimes contribute supplies or spend their own money for SNU event related efforts without seeking reimbursement. Since donations to the Kitty are completely voluntary and anonymous, no accounting is kept.

Your dues are mostly symbolic rather than economic necessity. By paying the annual **\$10** SNU dues you are saying you support what the SNU does and how it does it and would like to see the group keep doing it. Even if you can't directly participate in SNU events and camaraderie, you are with those who can in spirit and maybe, sometime on down the road, you will be able to join in person. Whether or not you participate in SNU events or volunteer as an officer or event host, you can keep in touch via newsletter, website, and correspondence. You can let the SNU know how to lend your voice to WBCCI matters if the SNU is your home unit. You have a voice in the SNU to suggest changes or events for the club. Your dues keep it going doing what it does.


