Dessert was buttermilk/brown sugar

Little Known SNU Facts or Known Only to a Few

SNU members are always on the lookout for new campgrounds and dispersed camping areas for our weekend rallies. While not entirely new, the SNU hadn't visited the Rye Patch Campground group site (April) in many years. We visited Walker River State Rec. Area, Nevada's newest state park, in May and August's Hope Valley Rally was our first new dispersed site in years.

With your help we plan to keep stirring up the mix of rally locations for 2020. Yes, we'll throw in some old favorites to keep travel distances reasonable, especially in early spring and late fall when weather can be a factor. To that end, many of us continue to seek out new rally spots., Gail and I took a side trip through the Alabama Hills after the 2017 Boca Rest Rally to look at dispersed sites among the historic movie locations. Last year we searched out locations along the Gerlach-Cederville Road (Washoe County 447) where a private lake looks promising and mid state along US 50 at Hickison Petroglyph Rec. Area (promising for a small number of rigs). March travels after the Washoe Lake Rally gave me a perspective on Walker River. Our April travels took us to Berlin-Ichthyosaur State Park and Death Valley's Stovepipe Wells Campground. Jerry Thornburg, Bob Kirksey and I checked out the upper sections of Walker River Canyon near Bighorn Camparound (too far on rough roads and difficult to negotiate with larger trailers and RVs). Heading home from Walker, Gail and I visited numerous dispersed sites and small campgrounds from June Lake south to Lone Pine; Aerie Crag, Silver Lake, Gull Lake, Reversed Creek, Oh Ridge, Baker Creek, Tinnemaha, Taboose Creek, Goodale Creek and Diaz Lake. We continued our search after Lassen driving much of the Virginia Lakes, Dunderberg and Virginia Creek Roads above Conway Summit looking at dispersed sites and primitive campgrounds. Dunderberg offered sites for 2, 4, maybe more trailers but requires negotiating a somewhat rough forest service road; would be better for smaller trailers. A high clearance four-wheel drive would be recommended but not required but recommended, although a rally here would be a SNU category 4, Adventurous. The primitive campgrounds, along Virginia Creek Road would be classified category 5, Jerry's Site, "what road?", not for the steepness or roughness of the road but for negotiating the tight turns, squeezes

between trees and turn around areas with a truck and large Airstream trailer. These campsites are great for intermediate camp locations for Gail and I traveling north and south along the Eastern Sierra Nevada mountains or for 2 and three trailers but some are too far or don't lend themselves to a regular SNU rally of 6 rigs or more so be on the lookout; you may find the next great rally site!
