This month's member spotlight recognizes Richard (Wheels) and Doris Wheeler, but it's with sadness that we report that Wheels passed away on February 27, 2020.



Wheels and Doris have been long time members and supporters of the Sierra Nevada Unit. They joined the Unit in 2006 and quickly adapted to the SNU's boon docking and dry camping style.

Wheels was an airplane buff, stemming from his years in the US Air Force He continued to enjoy the hobby at fly-ins and as a member of

the Civil Air Patrol. Airplanes weren't his only passion, he and Doris put many miles on their Airstream criss crossing the US visiting family, camping, attending rallies, International Rallies and WBCCI caravans. Wheels and Doris named their trailer long before Airstream developed its naming program; theirs was the "Silver State Spirit", easy to spot with its pink racing flamingos on each side.

Wheels continued to support the Sierra Nevada Unit writing articles for the Airstreamer - 2008 Unintended Dry Camping & 2012 Winter Travel, sharing rally reports, travel photos, diaries and developing travel checklists - Personal Packing, Clothes, Departure, Arrival and Winterizing, for both the newly initiated trailer traveler and those of us who occasionally forget.

I think it was 2008 at our November Death Valley Rally when we found that Doris had a gift she had kept hidden from us, she disclosed that she was a country music singer in her youth and brought out a guitar to serenade us in the evening around the camp fire. Her music drew a fellow camper to walk down with his banjo and ask if he could join us.

Well no good deed goes unpunished and for their support we supported them and elected Wheels as SNU president in 2013 and 2014. Least I forget, Wheels was crowned Hobo King at the 2013 Hobo Rally in Blythe, California; Doris was crowned 2014 Hobo Queen at the final Hobo Rally held. In the last few years Wheels and Doris's health limited some of their travels for rallies and caravans but the desire to continue in the Airstream lifestyle burned strong. 
