

Wind made it difficult to share meals Friday night and meals were eaten inside the balance of the weekend. SNU members Von and Yvonne reported on the October Region Rally in Hemet, the coming Rose Prade and Blythe Hobo Rallies. Anita Leipper reported that film "Village Barbershop", shot in Reno and Napa, featured the interior of a 1950s Airstream. Of important mention was the Sierra Nevada Unit's upcoming 35th Anniversary to be held in September 2011 at Campground on the Lake with a Lake Tahoe dinner cruise at Zephyr Cove (2021 is our 40th Anniversary).
